


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
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

- Will God always say something new?


Her joy of discovering God's voice for the first time was profound.

What a wonder!



n 1 Corinthians 3:6, the Apostle Paul says, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth."

Child Evangelism Fellowship is all about making Jesus known to children and teenagers around the world. We are committed to planting seeds that produce fruit. But we don't do it alone.

During Christmas 2016, a CEF team, including trained volunteers from a partnering church, visited the small Muslim village Sovjan in southeast Albania. The team conducted a Christmas Party Club for children with songs, games, and a lesson about the true meaning of Christmas. Many children heard for the first time how Jesus Christ loves them so much He come down to earth, suffered, died, and came alive again so they can have a forever friendship with God. Jesus is indeed the greatest gift ever. About 300 children heard this Good News that day. Many wanted to know more about Him and some even brought their parents to the meeting. There was a hunger for Jesus.

The children who were reached, and even the adults, needed to be established in a local Bible believing church for Christian growth. This is why church partnerships are so valuable. CEF helps churches fulfill their challenge to reach their neighborhood and to the end of the world (Acts 1:8), and

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church partners provide important follow-up ministry to encourage Christian growth.

At that moment it was clear, Sovjan needed a church. Our partnering church, the Evangelical Church of Libonik-Maliq,



immediately invited the children and parents who were present to meet again the following week. Many came. The children's ministry continued, and an adult meeting started. After one year, there was a church with a regular Good News Club and church ministry. Over time, the group grew in number, and they no longer fit in the place where they met.


After much prayer and discussion, the local church created a partnership with the Albanian Church in Chicago and with The Moody Church. Through them, God provided a new church building in that village. The church was dedicated on Easter 2023 by Erwin Lutzer, Pastor Emeritus of The Moody

Church. Along with CEF workers, over 150 people celebrated the mighty work God alone started and continues to do in a small Muslim village in southeast Albania.

The Evangelical Church of Libonik-Maliq and its pastor have followed the CEF strategy for Christmas Party Clubs. In the last nine years, they have successfully planted seven churches in villages reached through their ministry partnership with CEF. Looking back, it all started with prayer, CEF staff training and equipping local church volunteers, Christmas Party Clubs, and people with passion and a heart to give glory to God in everything they do.

The Good News Club affiliated with the Solomio church began in May 2023. The club has 41 children of mixed ages. They are enthusiastic about the games and enjoy the social interaction during club.

The change in the children has been notable. They have become more obedient to their parents, improved in self-awareness, and are able to recite verses and apply them to their lives. Now more leaders are needed to cope with the growing numbers.

THE PICTURE OF AN UNSTABLE COUNTRY THROUGH GOD'S LENS

mong the world's most unstable countries, South Sudan has the highest poverty rate in the world and faces ongoing violence, a severe hunger crisis, and devastating flooding. Yet these challenges cannot stop God. His constant provision and protection enable CEF missionaries to faithfully share the Good News of Jesus.

SUCCESSFUL OUTREACH

In May, while children were on school break, our missionaries teamed up with Christian Youth In Action participants to run 5-Day Clubs in many areas. As I visited and even taught in a few clubs, I was excited to see children openly respond to the message of salvation. Parents also came to listen to the Word of God. They appreciated the impact CEF had in their children's lives and many requested to host a 5-Day Club. We organized 73 clubs and reached 9,311 children with 3,800 professions of faith. The saved children are discipled through Good News Clubs, Bible camps, and local churches.

GETTING TO THE UNREACHED

At the beginning of the year, we asked God to help us start CEF ministry in a new area. God answered our prayer through Viola, one of our volunteers. We received reports of how Viola reached children in Terekeka and the great need to establish ongoing ministry there. Terekeka has an unreached population, the

Mundari, who are among the hostile communities in South Sudan. Pray for the teams and the plans to establish ministry in Terekeka in 2024.


EQUIPPING THROUGH LITERATURE

We have been blessed with CEF literature for the ministry and distribute it to churches and partner ministries. These materials transform the lives of boys and girls as well as church leaders. We receive positive testimonies from pastors and children's workers who say CEF materials make it easier to reach and disciple children. Last year we distributed materials to over 2,500 Sunday school teachers and 5,000 children. Our goal this year is to strategically distribute literature to at least 6,000 teachers and benefit 150 churches. We also plan to distribute 150,000 copies of The Gospel of John, Meet the King!, and Do You Wonder Why? to boys and girls.









Trained and equipped nationals are the ideal individuals to minister to children in their countries. They already speak the language, know the culture, and can work where people of other nations are not

Since 1972 the Sponsor-A-National[™] program has provided financial assistance to trained nationals who live in areas where it is difficult to raise support. Presently, over 1,400 CEF national 140 countries receive assistance through the SPAN[™] program. This enables them to spend more time sharing the Good News about Jesus



FRIK JANSE VAN RENSBURG, SOUTHERN AFRICA/INDIAN OCEAN REGION

n August 1991, my wife and I attended the 12week Children's Ministry Institute® not knowing that God would lead us to join CEF to share the Gospel with children and adults in many countries all over the world.

I completed a one-year internship while taking a course in preventative health and studying French (the second official language of Madagascar) with hopes to one day learn Malagasy (the national language of Madagascar). God blessed us and we thank Him we never went to bed hungry. We learned we could trust Him in all things. All four of our children accepted Jesus as Savior before they were four years of age.

For eight years I served as national director of CEF Madagascar. God provided good workers and supporters. Our ministry began with four street children. We registered CEF with the government and established national leadership. The year we left Madagascar, almost 8,000 children were reached. God chose Pastor Diavolana to serve as the new national director of CEF Madagascar and blessed him with a big team. This year we believe

they will reach more than one million children. Keep praying for Pastor Diavolana and the CEF family in Madagascar.

For the next 24 years, God allowed me to serve as regional director of the Southern Africa/Indian Ocean Region. God blessed this region with growth from 167,000 children reached annually to almost 3 million. The ministry expanded from a few countries to all 16 countries in the region.

God blessed again in directing me to identify Jossefa Ngomane from Mozambique as a successor to train under me. This past June he became the CEF regional director for Southern Africa/Indian Ocean Region. Pray for Jossefa in this new position.

As I prepared to retire, CEF leadership had something else in mind. They asked me to become the area director for the six islands in the region. I will travel, train, lead, equip, and support. I trust God will continue to direct and provide. Our goal is the same for these six countries:

Every Child • Every Nation • Every Day.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES INSTITUTE, SRI LANKA



s an important part of CEF strategy to reach Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day, training prepares men and women to effectively evangelize and disciple children. Over 400,000 people are trained annually through seminars, courses, and the Children's Ministries Institute. Each year the 12-week Institute is held in about 20 locations around the world. Last June, 17 students completed CMI® in Sri Lanka. All of them have become staff for CEF Sri Lanka. Here's what some had to say:



"CMI was all about how to train teachers to teach children in Good News Club, Party Club, 5-Day Club and more. Learning how to teach children effectively was so helpful. I enjoyed the instructors and learned many new things. Children's Ministries Institute® offers one of the most innovative practical training programs available for leaders in children's ministry. This 12-week diploma program can be taken in one- or two-week modules. Students receive training in direct ministry to children, teacher training and ministry organization, and leadership.
