

Imagine walking between almost flooded rice paddies to go to the children, meeting a drunken man along the way, or being soaked in the rain to invite the kids. These were some of our Christmas Party Club experiences. But we were certain we were not alone, that our God was with us, and seeing children come to faith in Christ made it all worthwhile. How encouraging to witness God's work in the hearts of the people. In one place, a grandfather volunteered to set up a big tarp to make shade for the children from the heat of the sun. At another club, we were gathered in a vacant lot when suddenly heavy rain started. People across the street offered us their garage and club went on. Our last club, with the greatest number of children, needed chairs. One by one, parents who brought their children left and came back

carrying bamboo benches and plastic chairs. As for snacks and giveaways—God provided as people responded to a pastor's request—like the grandmother who donated the money for her granddaughter's birthday celebration and the four couples who chose not to do the usual gift exchange and instead sent money for Christmas Party Club."

Refugee Ministry Continues

SOUTH SUDAN

"ve heard already of over 50,000 refugees fleeing to the northern areas of South Sudan. We don't know how many will come, but we are burdened to share the Gospel with the boys and girls who have a dire need of relief and comfort from the Word of God," shared Francis Candiga, national director of CEF South Sudan.

Candiga is no stranger to refugee ministry. In 2015, he was displaced with his own family and children, along with millions of others, after the South Sudanese civil war began. They found themselves in a northern Ugandan refugee camp, where he slowly connected with other displaced *Child Evangelism Fellowship*® staff members in camps nearby. Since 2016, *CEF*® reaches thousands of South Sudanese children in Ugandan refugee camps each year with the Gospel of Christ. Ministry continues in over 50 camps for children in these areas.

into their eighth week of fighting, forcing hundreds of thousands of Sudanese citizens to seek safety in neighboring countries.

Candiga reported, "Those who are now coming into Juba [capital of South Sudan] are mostly South Sudanese, returning home from the war there after fleeing years ago. Many are arriving at the Juba airport with no home to return to, so we started ministry to reach children there until their families can connect with relatives and settle back into the country.

"Please pray as we reach the Sudanese people who are displaced along the northern border. We desire to reach the children in these areas, but there are many challenges. This is far from our primary ministry areas. Due to insecurity and fighting, traveling on the roads is risky. It is best to fly in,



to take the Gospel to children there and we hope to go there soon."

As former refugees themselves, Candiga and the *CEF* staff continue to minister to children in need of hope. Candiga shared, "Refugee children are in crisis. Their circumstances are poor and they have many disadvantages. Some come to our camps not having eaten for days. Others are sick and malnourished with wounds on their bodies. It is a difficult and emotional situation. We meet them where they are and share the Gospel with them. The Good News brings hope. We share that Jesus cares for them and is always there during times of trouble."

During the pandemic, stability and security increased in much of South Sudan. Many returned to their homes. Candiga works to restart children's

ministry in new areas of the nation, seeking God's timing and wisdom. "Our workers and volunteers are reaching a lot of children in hostile communities. Sometimes, if an area becomes insecure, entire communities disperse and return to Ugandan refugee camps. We are not discouraged—we will continue going back to reinforce and strengthen the ministry, even in these areas," said Candiga.

Pray for the children of Sudan, as their hearts seek hope that can only be found in Jesus Christ. Sharing the Good News with these children is how Candiga and his staff persevere despite challenges. Every day they minister to refugee children like Samantha, who shared, "I want to thank God for changing my life in this refugee camp. Before I came here, I was just a sinner. Now, Jesus has forgiven all my sins. I am a changed person."



arlier this year, after a devastating earthquake struck southern and central Turkey and northern and western Syria, CEF quickly distributed Do You Wonder Why? booklets to those affected.

Ali* said, "When the earthquake happened, I thought God had lost control of the earth. But when I read this book, I knew the truth that God still controls everything."

Ahmed* said, "I had a terrible fear when the earthquake occurred and the walls of our house cracked. Reading this booklet made me feel calm and helped me trust God to protect me."

he Gospel door is closed at Lunbei. I tried to visit local churches and the Gospel Center; however, they were not welcoming to me. According to a conversation I had with the Gospel Center, the local church is worried about sharing the Good News with children, as they are afraid this will break the existing relationship they have with them. This area has a strong traditional ancestor worship, and parents are afraid that when their children accept Jesus as Savior, they will no longer burn incense for them. Burning incense to their ancestor is important

to them. They believe they need blessings from their ancestors to give them peace,

health, and wealth.

When this door closed, I didn't give up because the Lord didn't tell me to give up. I pray and meditate on Matthew 10:16, "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." I feel I need to serve them to remove some cultural barriers before I can share the Gospel with children. Please join me in praying about this.

He orchestrated everything. Before this, it was difficult for us to invite children or parents to listen to the Gospel in the park as we received many rejections. However, on Easter Sunday, we shared the Gospel message with over 20 children, and about 8 of them received Jesus!

Moving Forward Despite Cyclone

MALAWI

EF Malawi now has 10 committed full-time missionaries with over 200 volunteers reaching out to children through different ministries. Considering the high population in Malawi, we earnestly pray for God to send more laborers (Luke 10:2). Glory to God for opening doors for training. Our prayer is that God would give passion to those trained to get involved with CEF Malawi.

We thank God for the children who heard the Gospel. Between January and March, 62,745 children were reached through a variety of ministries and 37,952 received Jesus as Savior. During this time, Cyclone Freddy hit the southern and eastern regions where most of our missionaries live.





SENSITIVE COUNTRY

fghan families fleeing the Taliban need love and support. In the summertime we reached about 70 people in two projects for refugees. Afghan children are often traumatized by the hardships they endured in their country. We were privileged to have 30 of them attend camp this summer. After we taught that God created and loves each one of us, a boy asked, "Does God really love me and am I worth more than the most valuable car in the world?" We could answer him, "Yes, God loves you very much because He created you."

Over 100 families attended a large project in a region of our country that was new to our ministry. We had 150 gifts for the children, but that was not enough because there were so many children and teens. The children were happy because many families in this region are poor and cannot afford gifts for their children. We worked

to make good connections with the local school for future support for families and to share the Good News of Jesus.

In another part of the country, people live in mountainous areas that are difficult to access. There is hardly any infrastructure—running water, shops, electricity. Cars cannot get there, so people usually use horse-drawn carriages or donkey carts. In one village we use a donkey that walks slowly, but with God's help we always arrive safely. When weather permits, we visit these remote villages and bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to people and especially to children. Unfortunately, children often have no time to listen because they have to work in the fields. These people have hard lives, but they are hospitable and there are a few who enjoy hearing the Gospel. One family has already accepted Jesus as Savior.



Trained and equipped nationals are the ideal individuals to minister to children in their countries. They already speak the language, know the culture, and can work where people of other nations are not welcomed.



Since 1972 the Sponsor-A-National™ program has provided financial assistance to trained nationals who live in areas where it is difficult to raise support. Presently over 1,300 *CEF* national missionaries receive assistance through the SPAN™ program each month. This enables them to spend more time sharing the Good News about Jesus with the children.

Understanding God and His View of Children

ollowing the Teaching Children Effectively™ Level 1 course, one student said, "Although I went to a Christian high school and learned Bible doctrines, there was chaos in my head. God spoke clearly to me through this course. I understood who He is, what sin is, what Jesus did and who He is, and how to tell children the message of salvation. Now there is order in my head."

One parent who attended the course said, "My mind was very dark. I didn't believe a

child could be saved, but after hearing the experiences and Bible passages you presented, I understood children can receive Jesus as their Savior. I went home and taught my children The Wordless Book. As I taught, I saw tears in the eyes of one of them. At the end, he said, 'I want to invite Jesus into my life.' When I saw God spoke to my child's heart, my mind was no longer in darkness. Now I believe with all my heart that a child is not too young to listen to God's voice and be changed."
